RESULTS & RECAP for: ECCC Championships / PSU (4/27-28th)

The final ECCC race of the cycling season was Easterns Championships in College, PA on the campus of Penn State University. Whereas last year's Eastern's took place in cool conditions, this year the riders were met with sun and milder temperatures! Last year only 6 made the trip, this year we had the entire team of 13 go! By the end of the weekend, the team would score 228 points, leaving us in 7th place for the championships!

Saturday April 27th – Team Time Trial (TTT – 10mi)

Last year we fielded only one TTT squad, whereas this year our larger traveling team was able to field four separate teams! After some miscues in Philly several weeks ago, out Men's B squad (Wilson, Drew, Ben and Simon) rode like a well-oiled machine and took 3rd place. I wish I could say the same for the Men's C squad (Russell, Edgar, Christian and Sid) who had a communication break down and could not seem to get on the same page and only finished with 2 riders – that being said they took 5th place but were only 9 seconds out of 2nd! I can only dream what they would have posted as a team of four at the finish! The Men's D team did well to take 4th and the women's B team of Kari and Amy took 3rd as well.

Saturday April 28th – Road Race (RR – 40mi)

The Block Mo road race course has always been a tough one as it contains a climb over 6 miles in length. After early success in the TTT but no wins, we were hoping to do even better

in the road race. The Men's D and C races saw early breaks dominate with Jorge able to take second in the D1 race and Simon 4th in the C1 race. Kari did well to take 3rd in the Women's B race, but the ultimate race of the day was the Men's B. Ben Calvert began the season as a D, quickly moved to Cs and this weekend raced as a B. He launched an early break on lap one with a couple others and never looked back. Wilson and Drew tirelessly blocked for him in the pack and Ben's break quickly gained a 1 minute advantage on the field. It came down to 2 for the win and Ben was able to take the sprint and the victory (our 12th win on the year).

Sunday April 28th – Criterium

The Sunday fraternity row criterium was on a short 1km course with 6 corners, so it was clear the races would be fast and many would not be able to keep up with the speed of the leaders through the narrow corners. The Men's D race started fast with both JR and Sid holding positions up front and finishing in the front pack. In the Men's C, Simon would go hard from the gun and really break up the field, but fell victim to a late crash (as did Russell), leaving only Edgar up front. The Women's A/B race strung out early and Kari had to work hard to stay in contact, but she would soldier on and eventually get into the main pack. As the laps wore on you could see her confidence growing, and she would take 5th for Women's B. The Men's B race was very exciting, with both Drew and Wilson riding hard at the front from the gun in an attempt to stay out of trouble (as the day saw numerous crashes across all of the

races). Columbia would go to the front with 3 to go to string out the field, and Wilson was quick to respond (but Drew got caught in a late crash). With 1 lap to go, Wilson led the field through and never relinquished the lead, coming out of the final corner in the same spot and having enough left in the legs to win the sprint! Our 13th win of the season!
